

FACT SHEET

Permits from Entities outside Wayne County that may be needed (It is the responsibility of the owner/contractor to contact agencies outside of Wayne County):

- If work is being done in waters of the State or a wetland - the Army Corps of Engineers should be contacted for the following activities:
 - o Any activity in a stream or wetland in Chester, Clinton, Wooster or Franklin Townships.
 - o Activities including, but not limited to, greater than 500 feet of bank stabilization or pipeline installation, greater than 10 C.Y of fill material in a water of the State or greater than 1/10 Acre of wetland disturbance in any township. Requirements are subject to change; complete guidance on activities that are covered by the Army Corps of Engineers 404 Permitting process is available at: <http://www.lrh.usace.army.mil/Missions/Regulatory/LawsRegulations.aspx> or the applicant may call the Huntington, West Virginia District of the Army Corps of Engineers at (304) 399-5210.
 - o The correspondence with the Corps can be a letter or form No. ENG 4345, which is available with instructions at the following web address: <http://www.usace.army.mil/Missions/CivilWorks/RegulatoryProgramandPermits/ObtainPermit.aspx>
 - o If you are unsure as to whether or not you are planning to do work in waters of the State or a wetland, you may contact the Army Corps of Engineers at the above phone number. Also National Wetland Inventory Maps are available for review in the Wayne SWCD office.
- If a pond is being constructed, an ODNR Construction Permit may be required:
 - o If the dam height is less than six (6) feet, a permit is not required, regardless of the storage capacity.
 - o If the storage capacity is less than 15 acre-feet, a permit is not required, regardless of the dam height.

- An Ohio EPA Notice of Intent (NOI) form is required to be submitted to the Ohio EPA if the proposed activity disturbs:
 - o one or more acres; or
 - o less than one acre is disturbed, but the project is part of a larger common plan of development that will disturb more than one acre.

- If a new access/drive or improvement of an existing drive in the road R-O-W is being constructed onto a state route and ODOT permit may be required:
